

Mississippi Arts & Culture "Artinerary" Tour

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Day 1 - Meridian

The Mississippi Arts + Entertainment Experience, aka "The MAX," perfectly presents Mississippi's cultural legacy through fun, interactive experiences that seek to inspire the next generation of artists. Be sure to check out the event schedule for the MSU Riley Center, an elegant performance venue, built in 1890, that originally served as a grand opera house.



Day 2 - Metro Jackson

Check out the Mississippi Museum of Art, in downtown Jackson, to see collected works of Mississippi artists and special exhibitions. Also in Jackson is Pearl River Glass, a studio with a national reputation for producing, restoring, and selling stained glass. In Ridgeland, you'll find the Bill Waller Craft Center, where you can see and purchase a variety of handcrafted items.



The Hattiesburg Public Art Trail features more than 50 sculptures and large-scale murals on display throughout the city. For a smaller, but equally captivating, experience be sure to check out the charming Hattiesburg Pocket Museum and its constantly changing collection that's displayed in a small alleyway window.



Day 4 - Coastal Mississippi

100 YEARS

Art lovers come to Coastal Mississippi from far and wide to experience the rich artistic legacy of our coastal communities. Start with a trip to the Ohr-O'Keefe Museum of Art in Biloxi, which is known for its collection of George Ohr Pottery and unique architecture. Then hit Ocean Springs, home to both the Walter Anderson Museum of Art and Shearwater Pottery.
